

2014 Annual Action Plan Outcome Summary

1. Steve DeFilippo was able to acquire 1 new contract of janitorial services at Columbiana County ODOT in 2014.
2. CHI was staffed based on acuity assessments.
3. CHI has a capacity limit of 74 and a waiting list enacted above that. Currently CHI has 65 individuals and all new adults must go through community employment first.
4. The entire Carroll Hills Program has adopted positive culture.
5. The Preliminary Implementation Component Tool is up to date.
6. The Board continues to get more staff trained in the Imagine Process and SSA staff are moving individual service plans into the new Imagine IS.
7. The Board has sponsored 16 self-advocates receiving Project STIR training. Individuals are trained at each provider site and encouraged to hold meetings. 2 Project STIR trained self-advocates have started trainings at CHI.
8. Gateway (ADAMH's Board housing corporation) is now in charge of Carroll Housing Opportunities, Inc. homes.
9. Jan Clayborn was in charge of PAWS, MSS, and CPT. Ray Heaston was making the supported living payments.
10. The Board purchased a new minivan to be used at CHA.
11. Amy Swaim and Kristen Long continue to scan in all Board records.
12. The Board implemented an Employment First Policy where any 18 year old or older individual with developmental disabilities will follow the path to community employment. Employment Specialist Sabrina Seal was hired. Sabrina was successful with 4 job placements in 2014 (2 at Wendy's and 2 through HARCATUS).
13. The Board continued participation in the Carroll County Early Childhood Collaboration Group.
14. The Board continued to provide school age services to 35 students.
15. The Board continued to provide preschool services and passed all inspections.
16. The Board continued providing early intervention services and Developmental Specialist Ryan Buck received PLAY model training.
17. The JET program was implemented for the second summer. The JET program was continued during the school year by the high school class students working at Knickers.
18. Project MORE was continued with volunteers from the community including some Carrollton High School students.
19. Transitional services continue to improve with Employment Specialist Sabrina Seal reaching out to teachers at Carrollton, Minerva, Brown Local, and Conotton Valley schools.
20. Family Selected Services continues to be a valuable support for 44 families.
21. The Board continues to contract with Mercy for speech, physical, and occupational therapy services for those in Early Intervention and works collaboratively with Help Me Grow.
