At the regular May meeting of the Carroll County Board of Developmental Disabilities held May 25, 2017 Mr. Campbell attended the Ohio Association of County Boards 2017 Spring Conference held at Columbus Easton Hilton on May 11-12. Topics of interest included new adult day services, federal updates, Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities updates, setting reviews, Early Intervention, and transition coordination. In order for Medicaid Wavier providers to receive payment all residential and non-residential services must provide individuals with full access to their community. Licensure for providers will review physical location, policies and practices, and person-centered planning.

Mr. Campbell, Director of Education Alicia Hall, and Service Coordinator Jill Cooper met with Stark County Educational Service Center (ESC) and Stark County Board of Developmental Disabilities on May 15. The meeting addressed the recommendation by Ohio Department of Developmental Disabilities to collaborate with another county in order to receive service coordinator grant money. Carroll County is due to receive \$41,381.

Mr. Campbell reported July 5th is the target date to move Carroll Hills Industries (CHI) to 1182 Roswell Road and the rest of county board staff and individuals without Medicaid Waiver funding to Board owned 540 North High Street. Next week the craft department will be moved to 1182 Roswell Road. Carroll Hills Industries is working on a new website [Carroll Hills Industries.com](http://CarrollHillsIndustries.com). Mr. Campbell was also informed by CHI Chief Executive Office Edgar Barnett of the need to increase full-time staff from 6 staff to 7 for privatization. Mr. Barnett will be hiring 4 subs to help with the transition.

Mr. Campbell was asked by Commissioner Jeff Ohler on the status of a \$100,000 match since the Commissioners are attempting to obtain a grant to expand the Commercial Park treatment plant. The Board approved for such expense when the Commissioners were applying for a grant to update the system based on a new building for nursing care in 2010. This \$100,000 will allow the school to have an updated treatment system and only pay a monthly usage fee. The Board agreed that this offer is still relevant.

In other business, the Board:

- approved payment of \$877.67 for April bills in the Hot Lunch account;
- approved payment of \$53,993.94 for April bills in the Residential Services account;
- Entered into executive session at 6:04 PM to consider the employment and/or dismissal of a public employee. Executive session ended at 6:28 PM.

The next regularly scheduled meeting is June 22, 2017 at 5:30 P.M. at the Administration Building.
